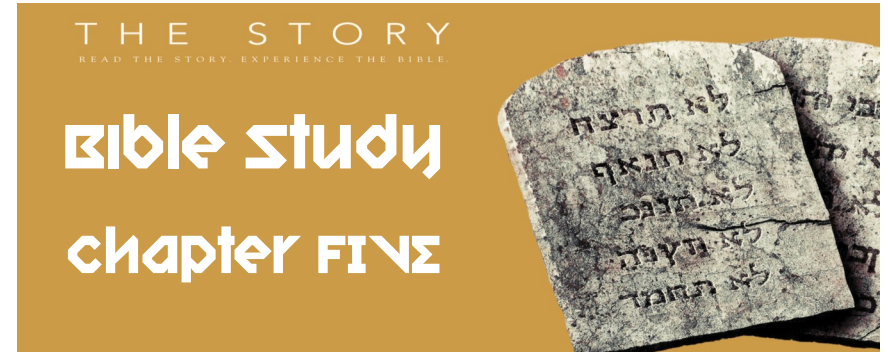

9. How does the Old Testament teachings depend on these two greatest commands?

10. Why did Moses put the veil over his face?

11. What does the veil symbolize when we think of the Old Covenant (law) and the New Covenant (grace)?

12. What was the purpose of the curtain in the tabernacle and the temple?

13. Read Matthew 27.50-51 How is the splitting of this curtain or veil important to the Christian believer? What does it symbolize.
