**REVIEW Isaiah 52.13-15**

1. Key FACT: God wants us to see (BEHOLD) JESUS \_\_\_\_\_ (HIGH), \_\_\_\_\_ (LIFTED UP), and \_\_\_\_\_ (EXALTED).
2. Key FACT: Each of us should be \_\_\_\_\_ (ASTONISHED) at what each of our sins cost Jesus.
3. Key FACT: through HIS sacrifice all humanity (ALL NATIONS) can now come to God. This message of redemption/salvation bring us to the choice to accept and submit to HIM as our \_\_\_\_\_ & \_\_\_\_\_ now or come before HIM without hope later.

**Isaiah 53.1**  
**The MESSAGE**

- ◆ Who has believed our message? And to whom has the arm of the LORD been revealed?
- ◆ This is a **universal message**. Isaiah speaks of \_\_\_\_\_ message.
- ◆ The resurrection and the men on the Emmaus Road.

- ◆ Luke 24.27 “beginning with \_\_\_\_\_ and with all the \_\_\_\_\_, He explained to them the things concerning Himself in all the Scriptures.”
- ◆ Genesis 12.3 & 22.18 the \_\_\_\_\_ would come from the line of Abraham. Fulfilled Matthew 1.1 & Romans 9.5
- ◆ 2 Samuel 7.12-13 & Isaiah 9.7 \_\_\_\_\_ would be heir to King David's throne. Fulfilled in Luke 1.32-33 & Romans 1.3
- ◆ There are 47 key prophecies in the Old Testament about the \_\_\_\_\_ that Jesus fulfilled.

### **Isaiah 53.1** **The CHOICE**

- ◆ Who has believed our message?  
And to whom has the arm of the LORD been revealed?
- ◆ The key is whether someone \_\_\_\_\_ or \_\_\_\_\_ the message.
- ◆ Romans 10.8-10 is about those who \_\_\_\_\_.
- ◆ But what does it say? “THE \_\_\_\_\_ IS NEAR YOU, in your mouth and in your heart”—that is, the \_\_\_\_\_ of faith which we are preaching, that if you confess with your mouth Jesus as Lord, and \_\_\_\_\_ in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved; for with the heart a person \_\_\_\_\_, resulting in righteousness, and with the mouth he confesses, resulting in salvation.
- ◆ Romans 10.6 is about those who \_\_\_\_\_.
- ◆ However, they \_\_\_\_\_ all \_\_\_\_\_ the good news; for Isaiah says, “LORD, WHO HAS BELIEVED OUR REPORT?”
- ◆ This is a quote from Isaiah 53.1 about people \_\_\_\_\_ the message. They are \_\_\_\_\_ all the teachings of the prophets including \_\_\_\_\_.
- ◆ This shows us that Isaiah is writing about Jesus and people \_\_\_\_\_ or \_\_\_\_\_ Him.



This week, we are looking at the second servant song. Here, we see the development of the identity and the mission of the Servant.

### **The SECOND SERVANT SONG Isaiah 49.1-13**

**MONDAY:** Similarities between 1st servant song and 2nd servant song. Read each pair of scriptures and determine why we need to know this. (42:6 and 49:6) (42:4 and 49:1) (42.10 and 49.6)

**TUESDAY:** How is 49.1 crucial in light of it being a theme of the second half of Isaiah in (46:3; 46:12; 51:1; 51:7; 55:2)?

**WEDNESDAY:** How does 49.2 depict imagery similar to that which appears in (Rev. 1:16; 19:15, 21)? How should we see or understand such language when applying it today?

**THURSDAY:** Each of the first six verses contains an element of Jesus’ ministry. Can you identify the following in these verses? Great Commission (Mt.28.18-20), New Hope, Personal failure, God glorified through the Servant’s (miracles), Preaching and teaching truth, Virgin birth?

**FRIDAY:** In the text, what service or ministry does the servant perform? List key descriptive words that help with the image of this service or ministry.

**SATURDAY:** There are a lot of references to land or the earth in this text (see vss. 1, 6, 9, 11, 12, 13). How would we describe the way the earth is involved in this announcement of redemption? What thoughts or feelings do we have about that? How does this image of land help us understand the Servant’s mission?

3. Mark 14.50 & Mark 15.15-20 This is two-fold. First, they did not want to see him when he was not popular. They refused to make EYE \_\_\_\_\_ with Him. Second, when He was beaten and prepared for crucifixion, He caused them to \_\_\_\_\_ . They were unwilling or unable to look on Him in His suffering (Psalm 22.1)
4. Here is the position of Jesus in the World today. Men have created over 4,200 religions to \_\_\_\_\_ Him. The Jews \_\_\_\_\_ Him while looking for a better replacement.



**Isaiah 53.1-3**  
**The Suffering Servant**

- ◆ Key: We all must answer the \_\_\_\_\_ whether we **BELIEVE** or **REJECT** Jesus.
- ◆ Key: His life before His ministry was tough, and He had no \_\_\_\_\_ that put Him ahead of anyone.
- ◆ Key: Jesus can \_\_\_\_\_ to the toughest problems, feelings, rejection, and defeat that any of us face.

**The Servant's OFFER**

"Come to me, all of you who are \_\_\_\_\_ and carry heavy \_\_\_\_\_ , and I will give you \_\_\_\_\_. Take my yoke upon you. Let me teach you, because I am humble and gentle at heart, and you will **find rest for your souls**. For my yoke is easy to bear, and the burden I give you is light." Matthew 11.28-30

**Isaiah 53.1**  
**The ARM of the LORD**

- ◆ Who has believed our message?  
And to whom has the arm of the LORD been revealed?
- ◆ This second half is about those who are now under the arm of the LORD. Revealed for salvation \_\_\_\_\_ revealed for judgment.
- ◆ Psalm 98.1 Sing to the LORD a new song, for He has done wonders; His right hand and holy arm have \_\_\_\_\_ Him the victory.
- ◆ John 12.37-38 But though He had performed so many signs before them, yet they were not \_\_\_\_\_ in Him. This was to fulfill the word of Isaiah the prophet which he spoke: "LORD, WHO HAS BELIEVED OUR REPORT? AND TO WHOM HAS THE **arm of the LORD BEEN REVEALED?**" (Isaiah 53.1)
- ◆ Luke 1.51 BSB He has performed mighty deeds with \_\_\_\_\_ ; He has scattered those who are proud in the thoughts of their hearts.

**The Servant's FORM**

- ◆ What we know about Jesus' appearance and ministry from the New Testament.
- ◆ "Is not this the \_\_\_\_\_ 's son? Is not his \_\_\_\_\_ called Mary? And are not his \_\_\_\_\_ James and Joseph and Simon and Judas? And are not all his \_\_\_\_\_ with us?" (Matthew 13.55-56)
- ◆ He was born in \_\_\_\_\_ , lived in **Egypt**, raise in **Nazareth**, His ministry headquarters was in **Capernaum** by the sea of **Galilee**. Visited **Jerusalem** often. As a child he was lost by His parents for three days when he was with the teachers, "listening to them and asking questions." Luke 2.46

- ◆ He walked, preached, taught, healed, slept, prayed, ate, performed miracles, got into arguments, and walked on water, just to name a few.
- ◆ But the NEW TESTAMENT tells us almost \_\_\_\_\_ about his childhood or what Jesus looked like. See Luke 2.52

### **Isaiah 53.2** **The Servant's FORM**

- ◆ For He grew up before Him like a tender shoot, And like a root out of parched ground;
- ◆ The term ' \_\_\_\_\_ ' is a poor translation. The word here is yoh-nek which literally is a " \_\_\_\_\_ ." This refers to a tough childhood like the branch of a tree that is usually cut off and burned.\* He would have been seen as having not future.
- ◆ Jesus was not raised like \_\_\_\_\_ but as part of a Jewish family struggling to survive. The family would have been considered poor.
- ◆ Jesus grew up in \_\_\_\_\_ and worked there until he was 30.
- ◆ LIKE A \_\_\_\_\_ OUT OF PARCHED GROUND: This shows how poor his childhood was.\* Like a seed on a dry land farm.
- ◆ The odds were against Him to those who were looking at Him from the outside. Here, on parched ground, is where God chose to raise his son. Jesus was already tested by the time He turned 30 and started His ministry.
- ◆ Jesus was a \_\_\_\_\_ growing on \_\_\_\_\_ . Jesus was a poor boy from the wrong side of the tracks, in a backwater town, with a minimal education and questionable lineage.

- ◆ He has no stately form or majesty That we should look upon Him, Nor appearance that we should be attracted to Him.
- ◆ Jesus was \_\_\_\_\_ **handsome** or **tall** like Saul. He did not stand out. There was \_\_\_\_\_ to make you think he was special.
- ◆ When Samuel was sent to anoint a King to replace Saul, he was sent to the home of Jesse. Samuel saw the first son tall and handsome and thought He had to be the new King.\*
- ◆ David was the eighth son and had to be sent for. "Now he was ruddy, with beautiful eyes and a handsome appearance." 1 Samuel 16.12
- ◆ According to Isaiah, the \_\_\_\_\_ (JESUS) was not tall or handsome; in fact, there was nothing in his appearance to attract you to Him.^

### **Isaiah 53.3** **The Servant's RELATIONSHIPS**

- ◆ He was despised and forsaken of men,
  - ◆ A man of sorrows and acquainted with grief;
1. John 1.11 He was not what they expected, and because of this, he was rejected. He did not have the looks, the credentials, or the lineage to be the \_\_\_\_\_ according to Jewish teachings.
  2. Matthew 9.36 & 1 Peter 2.24 & Luke 9.21-22 & Luke 9.51 Jesus \_\_\_\_\_ the coming DEATH with Him and directly \_\_\_\_\_ it three times while being aware of the time, way, and why he would die.
- ◆ And like one from whom men hide their face
  - ◆ He was despised, and we did not esteem Him.
